The "key "presentation took place between a representative of the **Bureau of Land Management and** the Mayor of Apache Junction, Chip Wilson. It was a joyous occasion.

Amongst SHA, there were five Board Members present and a good representation by members at this event. Also, East Valley Back Country Horsemen were there as well. Hooray for the horse community!

SHA Board Meeting Minutes of October 4, 2023

The SHA Board Meeting was held at Tina's and on Zoom on Wednesday, October 4th, 2023. The meeting started at 7:03 pm. Board Members of SHA who were present were: Darryl Cross, Sheila Shattuck, Pam Gaston, Jeanne Kennedy, Barbara Houck, Lisa Rogers, Peggy Wilson, and Roger Luth. Other SHA members were Chip Wilson, Director of Political and Equine Welfare, Susan Sullivan and Bob Johnson, Sharna and Jeff Watson, Bev Dougherty, Bob Diroff and Ann Adkins, Director of the SHA Store and Phil Fedor and Barb Houck online.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes and addendum from September were approved. Pam Gaston made a motion for them to be accepted and Roger Luth seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- TREASURER The Equine Welfare Account has \$1723.19 in it. There is \$7465.17 in the checking account. We had \$0 deposited in September. There was \$176 for two years for Post Office Box fee. There was \$26.40 paid for Stamps, and \$68.64 at Office Max by Lisa Rogers for September. We spent \$32 for the rental of the Rodeo Grounds total. All of this equals a total of \$303.04 that was deducted.

- MEMBERSHIP Barb Houck reported there are 36 memberships which includes 47 individual members.
- POLITICAL There is nothing City wise. On the National Level the EPA is trying to remove drugs for killing rodents and they want it to be more regulated because raptors and other animals are eating these dead poisoned rodents and the poison is killing those animals as well.
- EQUINE WELFARE Maria Jones has passed away and Chip Wilson reported the animals are still being properly taken care of on a regular basis. There were some open code violations regarding people living on the property in RVs which is illegal. The property has 40 horses living on two plus acres and the Department of Agriculture is going to keep a close eye on the situation. This will probably end up in court. Discussion ensued.
- PARADE The SHA Parade Unit will be in the Veteran's Day AJ Parade. There will be four rehearsals at the AJ Rodeo Grounds on Oct. 17, 26th and November 1st and the 7th. Practices start at 4 pm and the gates will open at 3:15 pm. The parade will begin on the 11th at 9 am. Discussion ensued about including the Pony Express and it was decided that Lost Dutchman Days would be better parade to include Pony Express Riders.
- SHA STORE Ann Adkins stated she sold three SHA shirts for the Rodeo Grounds Event on Friday. Ann Adkins went to a business in town and gave the Board some samples for perusal. We must order a

- minimum of 12 items per order. Discussion ensued about what to do with left over old SHA t-shirts.
- PROGRAM DIRECTOR Sheila Shattuck reported that SHA has been busy with other groups. There is a group in Payson called PATS, and START and LOST in the Superior area. On November 12th, there will be a Trail Ride after Cowboy Church and Randy Helm will be preaching. On February 11th, Randy Helm will be preaching at Cowboy Church and there are multiple trail rides on the 9th and 10th that are sponsored by Best of America by Horseback, a wellknown television show. Sign-ups are already available. It costs \$500 for a total weekend camping at the AJ Rodeo Grounds including meals, trail rides and tours in and around the City of AJ. Discussion ensued about a hitching rail at the Post Office. Sheila Shattuck suggested that SHA provide the meal for Sunday Evening for the television show. Sheila Shattuck made a motion that SHA provide the meal Sunday evening and we will go forward as we find out the cost. Pam Gaston seconded it. All were in favor. The Superstition Horsemen's Association will be sponsoring the Sunday evening dinner for the end to this event.
- AMERICORE is doing trail maintenance and work and there will be camping on November 8th, 9th and 10th at Haunted Canyon. Sheila Shattuck suggested that SHA could assist in the endeavor by perhaps providing food. We all agreed we would be ready at the next meeting for perhaps ideas for

We are going to help her, and we are going to need a burn permit and a water wagon or mule to make sure we can get most of it while remaining safe. Bob Dieroff has volunteered his tractor and Chip Wilson has volunteered his dump trailer. Darryl Cross believes the CDC will need to be contacted so October 28th would work out the best. Start time will be 8 am .

with the Pinal County flood control, Maricopa flood control district to construct and develop this retention facility. The Bureau of Land (BLM) and State Land are the landowners, and we must perform a complete NEPA study for BLM land to include a complete Archeological study. Currently BLM will not allow the city to perform any core samples to see what is below ground to help with cost estimates. Also, the Salt River Project has the right of way over this area for future power lines and we also must work with them to address this problem. The city just received the notice that we were awarded a 44-million-dollar grant from our Federal Government to install this retention and that will be about 1/2 the estimated cost. We are working with Pinal County Flood control and Maricopa Flood Control District on this important structure.
