SHA MEMBERS — It's time to VOTE

Here are the instructions for electronic voting on September 22nd-24th, 2023 for the SHA Election

Here's how online voting will work for members who have provided SHA with their email address.

- 1. You will receive an email entitled "Your Invitation to Vote in the Election: SHA Board Election" from SHA via noreply@electionrunner.com. It will tell you when the voting period is and give you a Voter ID and Voter Key.
- 2. Click the button that says "Click Here to Vote".
- 3. Enter your Voter ID and Voter Key on the webpage to open the ballot.
- 4. Fill in the ballot.
- 5. Click "Submit Ballot".
- 6. Confirm you want to submit the ballot.



Note: If your membership includes multiple people using the same email address, the ballot system can send multiple emails to the same email address, and each email will contain its own Voter ID and Voter Key. But each member needs to use only one Voter ID and Voter Key to submit their ballot.

You will notice there are changes such as staggered voting plus a few minor things. On your electronic ballot, you will receive a "YES" or "NO" for these proposed changes. Our last revision of bylaws was in 2010 so we certainly needed this revision and now it is up to you to approve it. Please read it and make sure it is something



SHA Board Meeting Minutes of September 6, 2023

The SHA Board Meeting was held on Teleconference on Wednesday, September 6th, 2023. The meeting started at 7:34 pm. Board Members of SHA who were present were: Sheila Shattuck, Pam Gaston, Jeanne Kennedy, Barbara Houck, Lisa Rogers, Peggy Wilson and Roger Luth. Darryl Cross was absent. Other SHA members were Chip Wilson, Director of Political and Equine Welfare, Sharna Watson and Jeff Watson.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes from August were approved. Sheila made a motion for them to be accepted and Roger seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- TREASURER The Equine Welfare Account has \$1723.19 in it. There is \$7768,21 in the checking account. We had \$ 0 deposited in August. There was \$26.40 paid for Stamps, and \$54.91 at Office Max by Lisa Rogers for June and July. The Office Max bill for August was \$60.95. This was paid to Lisa Rogers. Jeanne Kennedy also paid out \$118 for renting rooms for our Membership Meetings in January, February and March. It was \$118.00 because we had credit.

- MEMBERSHIP Barb Houck reported there are 97 memberships which includes 122 individual members.
- **POLITICAL** Chip Wilson reported on October 5th, The City of Apache Junction will host an event that is like a ribbon cutting celebration. The City of Apache Junction will be official owners of the Rodeo Grounds. Diverse groups will be invited including SHA, plus legislators and state representatives. Pinal County flood control and Maricopa Flood Control district will be working on this. The City of Apache Junction received 44 million dollars from the federal government for a retention basin of Weeks Wash. This is a threeyear project. The Salt River Project owns part of that for right of ways to place power poles in that land. This right needs to be eliminated for the retention pond to be constructed. The Bureau of Land Management did not allow core samples to be done and the archeology surveying still needs to be done by NEPA.
- **EQUINE WELFARE** There have been no new horse issues other than the three animals that have previously been discussed and turned into the Department of Agriculture and the Apache Junction Police Department. On another note, the Trainer Incentive Program is going to be cancelled; therefore, the Bureau of Land Management want to adopt out as many mustangs as people can take. The price of a gentle mustang is \$125. These mustangs can lift their feet, be caught and haltered and can get into a

- trailer. If you are interested in purchasing a mustang, go to a TIP Trainer or view the Mustang Heritage Foundation website to find a mustang or a TIP Trainer.
- PARADE If you are interested in being in the SHA parade group, please contact Pam Gaston at rrr97w@msn.com. Our next parade will be on Saturday, November 11, 2023, for Veteran's Day. We will have four practices before this parade and those practices will be at the rodeo grounds in October and early November. Those dates are October 17th, October 26th, November 1st and November 8th starting at 4 pm, gates open at 3pm.
- **SHA STORE** Ann Adkins was absent.
- **PROGRAM DIRECTOR** The SHA Christmas Party will be on Saturday, Dec. 2. There are tentative plans to watch the tree lighting and become involved in the community celebration including the electric light parade. Our AZ Trail Segment 17 and 18 needs to be looked at for possible maintenance. We are hoping to have a Trail Ride in November. Jeff and Sharna Watson are in charge and are talking about riding Brown Ranch with lunch afterwards. We need to have a Membership Drive on Saturdays where Apache Junction has community events. Barb Houck will reach out to our members and Pam Gaston will help organize.

- ROAD CLEANUP On November 4th at 8 am, we will have a road cleanup. Coffee and donuts will be there before eight and we will meet at the Rodeo Grounds at 8 am. Pickers will be supplied, and you need to bring your gloves and as many friends as you can gather. More people make for better and shorter work.
- PONY EXPRESS The SHA Pony Express will be held on March 2nd.
 Planning and organizational meetings will be coming up soon.
