

SHA Board Meeting Minutes of February 7, 2024

The SHA Board Meeting was held at Tina's on Wednesday, February 7th, 2024. The meeting started at 7:04 pm. Board Members of SHA who were present were: Darryl Cross, Pam Gaston, Jeanne Kennedy online, Peggy Wilson, Barb Houck, Roger Luth, Lisa Rogers and Sheila Shattuck. Other SHA members were Chip Wilson, Director of Political and Equine Welfare, Jeff Watson, Bev Dougherty, and Bob Diroff, online we had Phil Fedor, Ronna Lindstrom, and Sharna Watson.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes from January were approved. Roger Luth made a motion for them to be accepted and Pam Gaston seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- TREASURER The Equine Welfare Account has \$1723.19 in it. There is \$5807.23 in the checking account. We had \$1228.50 and \$60 deposited for Pony Express in January. There was \$1148.50 deposit for \$821.50 for the Silent Auction and Membership was \$140, 50/50 returned by Roger Luth \$40 and a donation from Richard Stern for \$100 donation and \$40 from David Read for 50/50 from EVBCH. There was \$26.04 paid for Stamps, we zelled Pam Gaston \$2000 and \$100

for the rifle and for the booth for EVBCH Fun Festival Booth. We paid for \$1057.80 for Insurance, Divine Signs for Pony Express was \$250.87. All of this equals a total of \$3437.71 that was deducted.

- MEMBERSHIP Barb Houck reported there are 82 memberships which includes 114 individual members.
- **POLITICAL** Nothing for political.
- EQUINE WELFARE Nothing for Equine Welfare.
- PARADE We will be riding in the Lost Dutchman Days Parade in Division 1. Pam Gaston will be attending a meeting on Feb. 21st to determine what number the SHA Unit will be. There are two practices left before the parade on the 24h of February. It is hoped the Pony Express riders will ride with the SHA Unit.
- SHA STORE Ann Adkins was absent.
- AJ RODEO GROUNDS There was a meeting tonight that was presented what AJ is going to do with the Rodeo Grounds this evening. Improving the infrastructure was the first item to address such as more power to the AJ Rodeo Grounds plus bigger grandstands. Also Hitching Rails in an enclosure that would allow people to park their horses in an area that is enclosed in case one of them gets loose. Jeff Watson has tremendous knowledge regarding facilities on what to do and will be put in by him on behalf of SHA and AJ. He recommends solar panels for federal funding assistance.

• PROGRAM DIRECTOR -

On February 9th, 10th and 11th there will be a television show, Best of America by Horseback, there will be numerous events including Darryl Cross and Chip Wilson being involved in a ride on Sunday. A day's event would be \$125 per day for riders, and \$425 for each double in one trailer or single in one trailer for \$475. This is a tremendous event for Apache Junction.

People will be coming in on February 8th. There are three rides planned and there are also chuck wagon dinners as well. Liz Langenbach and Riley King have helped a great deal from the Parks and Recreation Department. There are 30 riders coming from all over the US. Friday is a trail ride to Treasure Loop and then going to the Hitching Post with a special commercial followed by a chuck wagon dinner. Saturday, there is a Chuck Wagon Breakfast, The Deer Tanks ride, gun fight at Goldfield Ghost Town, followed by a chuck wagon dinner. Sunday there will be Cowboy Church with Randy Helm that is open to all, Chip and Darryl are leading a trail through downtown, and SHA is sponsoring the chicken dinner at 5 pm.

There will be a handoff on February 17th at the museum and a table from 10 to 2 pm.
For Western Day, the Pony
Express Members are going to do a running handoff on February
21st, for the children that are being brought by the schools.

Summary of the SHA General Membership Meeting of January 17, 2024 By Pam Gaston

The SHA General Membership Meeting was held in the multi-Gen Center, in room 118, and started at 7:11 pm. There were thirty-three people in attendance. The guest speaker was Clint Bradshaw, from MCSO, (Maricopa County Sheriff's Office), who is a deputy for the Mounted Patrol and has been employed by MCSO for 22 years. Officer Bradshaw showed us his 150-anniversary commemorative rifle made by Henry that he shoots with and then told us he has one that is on display in his home that is number 54 in a succession of four hundred being made only. The one he shoots with is number 368. The stock of the rifle is made from walnut. As he showed the rifle, he commented that part of the stock is fashioned after him as a model for the cowboy and horse that are depicted on it. Officer Bradshaw then told the group some remarkably interesting search and rescues and stories that he has participated in around the river area and the Superstitions. He stated the "wild horses" are doing well now and the javelina and deer population is increasing. It was a very interesting presentation and Officer Bradshaw was given a gift card to Black Angus in thanks for his time. His story is on the SHA Facebook page.

The results of the 50/50 were \$24 won by Roger Luth. Roger donated the money back to SHA and so there was \$48 total. The raffle for being there were three wild rags and one gift card. The first wild rag was won by Lori Morgan, the second wild rag was won by Melonie Floyd and the third wild rag was won by Glenna George. The \$25 gift card was won by David Read.

Officer Bradshaw stayed afterward and answered questions and showed the rifle; meanwhile, tickets for the rifle were being sold by Lori Morgan at \$20 cash per ticket. We are only selling two hundred tickets and then we are done with the raffle. Lisa Rogers was also selling Pony Express Postcards for the Pony Express that takes place on March 2nd.
