The Pony Express 2024 on March 2nd was a huge success.

There were approximately 750 postcards sold and they were carried approximately 30 miles. There were 27 riders with the first leg being done by Mayor Chip Wilson and the last leg being done by Councilman Darryl Cross. All riders were sworn in on March 1st by the Postmaster General to carry the mail and no one lost a horse, a hat or had any accidents. Many thanks to Lisa Rogers, Shirley Righi, Roger Luth, Pam Gaston and our good friend Donna for being part of the ground crew and taking care of pictures, the pace car and the back vehicle. A big thank you to the AJ Police Department for two officers in two different cars who kept riders safe and people on the streets aware of the rider coming by or handing off.

A huge thank you to the Hitching Post for their sponsorship and for all the sponsors who donated to this event. We wore your placards proudly. Everyone rode together at 2:30 pm on March 2nd from the Rodeo Grounds including Mo who rode leg 2 and also the group ride as well. Once in the parking lot of the Hitching Post, Darryl Cross handed off the mail to the Postmaster General who took it to the Post Office to be delivered. Everyone tied up their horses and had a nice cool drink in Tina's and a delicious lunch given to everyone by the Hitching Post. Everyone was given a commemorative concho and a bottle opener on behalf of SHA. It was a tremendous event, and we are already planning for next year.



SHA Board Meeting Minutes of March 6, 2024

The SHA Board Meeting was held at Tina's on Wednesday, March 6th, 2024. The meeting started at 7:04pm. Board Members of SHA who were present were: Darryl Cross, Pam Gaston, Jeanne Kennedy, Barb Houck, Roger Luth, Lisa Rogers, and Sheila Shattuck. Peggy Wilson was absent. Other SHA members were Ann Adkins, Director of the SHA Store, Cathy and Bob Diroff, Sylvia Drummond and online we had Sharna Watson.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes from February were approved. Roger Luth made a motion for them to be accepted and Pam Gaston seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- TREASURER The Equine Welfare Account has \$1,723,19 in it. There is \$6245.94 in the checking account. We had membership input from PayPal \$915.96 in February. Membership 50/50 returned \$20 from Bev Dougherty. There was \$27.20 paid out for Stamps. We paid Lisa \$95.46 in January for the Pony Tracks and February for \$127.28. We gave Bob Diroff \$21.48 for address labels and \$155.83 to Pam Gaston for the Chicken dinner for Best Across America. All of this equals a total

- of \$477.25 that was deducted. Darryl gave Jeanne \$100 bill as a donation that will go onto next month's finances.
- MEMBERSHIP Barb Houck reported there are 89 memberships which includes 123 individual members.
- POLITICAL Darryl Cross stated there is a proposal in the State Legislature that allows contractors to put in high density buildings wherever they want to place them without zoning. Please contact your local legislator to put a stop to this bill.
- ♦ Sheila Shattuck suggested we work with King Stables and the Goldfield Ghost Town, and we help them develop a corridor on BLM Land, so those businesses are NOT landlocked. It was decided that Sheila Shattuck would go to the CEOs of those businesses and see if we could advocate on their behalf with the BLM. This would be an assistance to them since we are a political organization.
- **EQUINE WELFARE** Nothing for Equine Welfare.
- PARADE Our presentation at the parade was excellent with 9 riders in the Parade unit, 7 riders in the Pony Express and 5 pooper scoopers. It was followed by a breakfast at Tarradiddles and presentation of gifts to Pam Gaston, Director, for her years of service. We are looking for another Parade Director. If you are interested, please let someone on the Board know of your intent.
- STORE DIRECTOR Ann Adkins showed us the new t-shirts in sizes

- XL, L, M, S, and they are \$19.50 apiece. They are bright blue with a V-neck. Ann asked the Board how much we should charge. Pam Gaston made a motion to charge \$25 per shirt and Sheila Shattuck seconded it. All were in favor.
- AJ RODEO GROUNDS Jeff Watson met with Liz Langenbach and Darryl Cross mentioned having better bandwidth communication for credit card usage and communication purposes that would involve putting in another cell phone tower.

• PROGRAM DIRECTOR -

- ♦ The Best of America will be aired the end of May or the first of June and were invited back to see us. Sheila Shattuck mentioned the website needs to be updated. She thought the picture needs to be changed and then highlight things that might "pop" more such as the Pony Express or horses on the trail with mountains and trail rides.
- ♦ Sheila Shattuck suggested April 14th for our end of the season party. Darryl Cross suggested a big steak fry or Bar-b-que with no constraints. Discussion ensued. Deadlines on names and members only as well would be necessary. Sheila Shattuck made a motion to get the Rodeo Grounds for a party on the 14th. Pam Gaston seconded it. All were in favor. Discussion ensued about cost. Pam Gaston made a motion to put a cap on the steak fry of \$1000. Sheila Shattuck seconded it. All were in favor.
