Cottonwood Springs Project

The BLM closure is still in effect along both sides of Hackamore Road.

Hackamore road is open to the Tonto National Forest and Bulldog Canyon trailhead. There is trailer parking at the trailhead, but you must remain on the road or parking area. The area 2.5 miles past the trailhead known as Cottonwood Springs is scheduled for new pipe rail construction to protect the springs by June 3, 2024. A grant to fund this project was submitted and obtained from Arizona State Parks off roading and is being monitored by East Valley Back Country Horsemen. The Cottonwood Springs project will be completed this summer.







SHA Board Meeting Minutes of May 1, 2024

The SHA Board Meeting was held at Tina's on Wednesday, May 1st, 2024. The meeting started at 7:06 pm. Board Members of SHA who were present were: Darryl Cross, Pam Gaston, Jeanne Kennedy, Sheila Shattuck, online, Barb Houck, Roger Luth, Lisa Rogers, and Peggy Wilson. Other SHA members were Bev Dougherty, Bob Diroff, Phil Fedor, online, and Chip Wilson, Director of Political.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes from April were approved.
 Pam Gaston made a motion for them to be accepted and Roger Luth seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- TREASURER The Equine Welfare Account has \$1773.19 in it. There is \$14,687.29 in the checking account. There was a deposit of \$559 and \$125.42 in withdrawals. There were Postage Stamps for \$29.92, \$75.50 for the Pony Tracks, \$20 to Liz Eason for a repeat membership. We deposited \$559 for donations which consisted of \$42, an ad from Tom Tuft for \$75, \$350 in memberships and \$65 for Tack-n-Stuff tables. Pam Gaston made a motion to take our longterm expiring CDs into short term CDs for 4 to 5%. Peggy Wilson seconded it. All were in favor.

- MEMBERSHIP Barb Houck reported there are ninety-one memberships which includes 126 individual members.

- **EQUINE WELFARE** Mules that were brought in from the desert have a story of the owner showing proof the mules were his. Their names are Bert and Ernie. They were released by a transport who, because the owner was not home, let the mules loose. It all ended up well. There have been reports of emaciated horses in poor condition that are ill kept but the addresses are not specific enough to allow good viewing from the road. Also, there was a report from a woman who viewed a horse that was in poor condition that she saw when she was riding.

- STORE DIRECTOR Nothing for Store Director.
- AJ RODEO GROUNDS The
 City Council voted on ways to
 improve the AJ Rodeo Grounds
 and methods to make money
 for funding. It will happen in
 three phases which is a twenty three million expenditure for
 renovation.
- PROGRAM DIRECTOR –
- ♦ Sheila Shattuck and Pam Gaston met with Rosie, who is the administrator for Project Help, for the Apache Junction Unified School District. Project Help is a program that helps poverty-stricken students who cannot afford various necessities to obtain those necessities through this program. Rosie, Sheila, and

- Pam discussed the possibility of opportunities for these students such as scholarships, trips to the museum with stations for the Forest Service, The Pony Express, packing, etc. There has also been a desire to start up a reading program with a book authored around horses. Discussion ensued about ideas to help the community.
- Sheila Shattuck through EVBCH worked with the Forest Service and gives a report every month regarding Cottonwood Springs which is going to be worked on to prevent ATVs and OHVs from running through it. A grant was obtained and now in May the project will begin construction. Thank you, Sheila Shattuck, and EVBCH for your hard work.

TRAIL RIDE NEWS - June 2007

Ride Review - Arizona Trail. As in January the weather once again tried to put a "damper" on our ride on the 21st of April. (And last month's ride was way too HOT!) Seven of us showed up at the Happy Camp Rd. trailhead on a cold overcast morning threatening rain. We headed north on the Arizona Trail and shortly donned slickers......which caused the showers to cease. The slickers kept us warm though, so we left them on until lunch. It was actually a great ride. A few wildflowers brightened up the landscape, and the brilliant tips of the ocotillos were in full plumage, dominating entire hillsides. Whitford Canyon was spectacular, with cliffs and crags of colors ranging from salmon, through reds to deep purple. We returned via a dirt road which led to a long sandy wash (Rice Water Canyon), which parallels the Arizona Trail route just to the east.

Ride Preview - Poverty Draw. Come to the cool country and ride in the pines. We'll have a campout weekend ride June 22-23-24, at Poverty Draw, near Clints Well, about 20-25 miles north of Pine/ Strawberry. Specifically, take the Beeline Hwy (#87) up through Payson, Pine and Strawberry, climb the Rim and go several miles to Forest Rd. 147 (about 5 or 6 miles past the turnoff for Forest Rd. 300). Take 147 right and drive about 2+ miles to SHA sign on the left. (It will be shortly after passing signs for Forest Roads 613 on right and 612 on left). There are a few corrals at the site and a water tank. You can drive in from either the north end or the south end. "Camp" is located in a beautiful draw. East Clear Creek....a beautiful ride....is nearby. As usual, we'll have a potluck feast Saturday night, so come prepared. The Sat. ride will begin at 10:00 a.m., and on Sunday we'll ride out at 9:00 a.m., to return by noon or 1:00. HOWEVER......if fire restrictions close the Coconino Forest, our ride that Saturday will be a moonlight ride in the Valley.


