

SHA Board Meeting Minutes of June 12, 2024

The SHA Board Meeting was held at Tina's on Wednesday, June 12th, 2024. The meeting started at 7:00 pm. Board Members of SHA who were present were: Darryl Cross, Pam Gaston, Jeanne Kennedy, Roger Luth, Lisa Rogers, Peggy Wilson and Barb Houck and Sheila Shattuck were online. Other SHA members were Bev Dougherty, Bob Diroff, Sharna and Jeff Watson, Tom Tuft and Chip Wilson, Director of the Political Committee.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes from May were approved.
 Pam Gaston made a motion for them to be accepted and Roger Luth seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- TREASURER The checking account has \$11,834.04. The Equine Welfare has \$1773.19. Deposits for the month were \$48. Withdrawals were \$2901.25 that consisted of \$97.30 for the cookout, \$29.24 for stamps. Checks were given to Darryl Cross for the Cookout that was \$566.57, the Safe Ride program for blinky lights were \$846.41 and for the Pony Express was \$1279.90 and a zelle to Lisa Rogers for the Pony Tracks for \$81.83.

- MEMBERSHIP Barb Houck reported there are ninety-two memberships which includes 127 individual members.
- **POLITICAL** Nothing for Political.
- EQUINE WELFARE The City has had some complaints about a horse in poor condition and they notified the Police Department. The Police Department contacted the Department of Agriculture. They saw the horse and declined to do anything about it.

On another case, there were pictures taken by a drone of a complaint about a horse in poor condition and the Police Department cannot use those pictures because they are not legal. There was also a complaint about 6 horses, a steer and dogs. The neighbors said the animals had not been fed in 3 days. The Department of Agriculture was called, and they had the City of AJ call the Pinal County who refused to do anything regarding the horses. They were asked to do a welfare check on a person and they did. They did this on Monday. On Sunday, there was a young man feeding the horses, but neighbors claimed they had not been fed in five days. The Department of Agriculture came out and they deemed the horses were not being fed so notified the owner who is currently residing in Prescott. Currently, they are all being fed including the dogs.

- **PARADE** Nothing for parade.
- **STORE DIRECTOR** Nothing for Store Director.

- AJ RODEO GROUNDS Nothing for AJ Rodeo Grounds.
- **PROGRAM DIRECTOR** The Forest Service is currently working on Cottonwood Springs, and they are about halfway through the project. Sheila Shattuck is willing to set up a campout or a Trail Ride if there is any interest. Also, Sheila Shattuck talked about a watch party for the TV Show, Best by America.
- **HISTORIAN** We are looking for a Historian. Do you like to Scrap Book? This is the job for YOU!!

OLD BUSINESS

- **PONY TRACKS** Roger Luth stated we need 250 copies for the Pony Tracks. There will be no July issue.
- PONY EXPRESS That date for the Pony Express Meeting is June 12th at 6 pm. The next Pony Express in 2025 will be on March 1st, 2025. We are going to purchase a 10x10, yellow pop-up tent in yellow. We are also going to get an ad in the newspaper thanking our sponsors and in the Pony Tracks. We also discussed expanding the route...one would be around Road Haven or coming from Queen Valley. Discussion ensued. Sheila Shattuck mentioned a supposedly historic trail behind the museum that also might be incorporated into the Pony Express. Discussion ensued. 
