

The SHA Board Meeting was held at Tina's on Wednesday, October 2nd, 2024. The meeting started at 7:00 pm. Other SHA members were Bob Diroff, Chip Wilson, Director of the Political Committee, Ed Kramer, Sharna Watson, Jeff Watson and Roger Luth. Barb Houck and Phil Fedor were online.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes from September were approved. Pam Gaston made a motion for the minutes to be accepted, and Sheila Shattuck seconded the motion. All were in favor.
- INTRODUCTIONS: Everyone introduced themselves: Darryl Cross, Chairman, Sheila Shattuck, Vice Chairman, Jeanne Kennedy, Treasurer, Pam Gaston, Secretary, Lisa Rogers, Director at Large, Judy Hood, Director at Large, Peggy Wilson, Director at Large and Jan Kramer, Membership Chair.
- TREASURER The checking account has \$9449.61. The Equine Welfare has \$1773.19. No Income for the month and expenses were

\$1389.82 which consisted of the plaque for Barb Houck, \$795.61, and PO Box, \$182, stamps, \$32.85, Pony Tracks to Lisa Rogers 63.36, Gift for Roger \$100, General Membership Meetings in the Spring, \$180, \$36 for room on Sat.

- MEMBERSHIP Jan Kramer reported there are 20 memberships which includes 30 individual members. Renewal membership forms will be in the Pony Tracks in October.


