SHA Board Meeting Minutes of December 4, 2024

The SHA Board Meeting was held at Tina's on Wednesday, December 4th, 2024. The meeting started at 7:03 pm. Board Members of SHA who were present were: Pam Gaston, Jeanne Kennedy, Judy Hood, Lisa Rogers, Peggy Wilson, and Sheila Shattuck. Jan Kramer and Darryl Cross were absent. Other SHA members were Chip Wilson, Barb Houck, Bob Diroff, Cheryl Davidson, Jeff Watson, Joan Bartz and Roger Luth.

- SECRETARY The Secretary's minutes from November were approved. Sheila Shattuck made a motion for the minutes to be accepted, and Pam Gaston seconded it. All were in favor.
- TREASURER The checking account has \$5,881.97. The Equine Welfare Account has \$1773.19. Income for the month is \$270 for membership and \$401 for Bingo equals \$671 for income. Expenses were \$160.48 for Bingo Cards, Stamps were \$36.50, Pony Tracks was \$258.72, Flyers for the gun was \$11.33. Expenses for the horses was \$485 for the vet, \$737 for supplies and dentist, total of 673.42, farrier was \$170 and \$503.42 for food and supplies. This equals \$1895.42 total for horses. Expenses for Nov was \$2362.45

that was spent including the horses and supplies for SHA.

- **MEMBERSHIP** –In NOV, Jan Kramer reported there are thirty single memberships, twenty-six family memberships and five honorary memberships.
- **POLITICAL** Chip Wilson was absent when this was mentioned.
- EQUINE WELFARE Shy Boy, the gelding, is at home at Jeff and Sharna Watson's residence. The two mares are at Sheila Shattuck's currently. Discussion ensued about the process and what we need to do with these horses. Judy Hood made a motion that Jeff and Sharna Watson be charged \$50 for an adoption of Shy Boy. Sheila Shattuck seconded the motion. All were in favor. Sheila Shattuck made a motion for Pam Gaston to take Believe to a trainer at her expense – Houston Davis was recommended. Pam Gaston seconded the motion. All were in favor. Sheila Shattuck made a motion to get a foster home for Bliss. Pam Gaston seconded it. All were in favor. Pam Gaston will send out an email blast to go out to the membership. Jeanne Kennedy recommended the 4H director to perhaps take Bliss. Chip Wilson stated he would get the contract together for the adoption process for the Watsons.
- PARADE Liz Eason has volunteered to lead the parade unit.
- STORE DIRECTOR Ann Adkins brought several SHA shirts to the meeting. If you want one, please see Ann.
- AJ RODEO GROUNDS There is

nothing for the AJ Rodeo Grounds other than infrastructure building.
